TEN TIPS FOR INTERVIEWS

- 1. **BE PUNCTUAL FOR YOUR APPOINTMENT** First impressions count!
- 2. LOOK GOOD AND DRESS SENSIBLY Social clothing is not always appropriate for the working environment
- 3. **BE ENTHUSIASTIC** You will not be selected for the job/college/ sixth form place if you demonstrate you are not really interested in it at interview
- 4. **DO SOME RESEARCH BEFOREHAND** Some knowledge of your prospective employer and his or her business always impresses and may put you ahead of your rivals for the post/likewise if applying for college/sixth form, research courses they offer/content etc
- 5. **BE HONEST AND ANSWER QUESTIONS TRUTHFULLY** Economy of the truth will invariably be discovered to your detriment
- BE CONFIDENT Sit up! Don't slouch! Speak up and look your interviewer in the eyes, shake hands at the beginning and end of the interview
- EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED Listen to the radio and read some newspapers/online articles before the interview – and have an opinion
- 8. **BE SURE YOU WANT THE JOB/COLLEGE/SIXTH FORM PLACE** It's all about attitude. Employers want to employ people who can join in running the business. College/sixth forms want students who want to learn and participate in all aspects of college/sixth form life
- BE POLITE AND CHEERFUL It may be cool to not 'be bothered'. You
 may be dealing up front with customers and if your demeanour is
 wrong they will 'be bothered'
- 10. DO JUSTICE TO YOURSELF Show them who you are, what are your strengths, hobbies & interests; the grades may not be first class but demonstrating a willingness to learn and an honest and cheerful disposition makes up for oceans of academic achievement in some jobs.
