Subject: Design & Technology

Intent

- It is our intent that pupils with special educational needs/disabilities (SEN/D) follow the same curriculum, learn alongside their peers and achieve similar outcomes.
- In addition, they may benefit from additional opportunities in the lessons and in the extracurricular activities that are arranged especially for them.

Implementation

As a result of extensive in-house training we are confident that all teachers are effective teachers of pupils with SEN/D and that pupils should be withdrawn from mainstream lessons only when there is a clear rationale for doing so and all relevant stakeholders have been fully consulted.

Consequently, within our subject area, pupils with SEN/D are supported by:

• Sound and light sensitivity

- Using a sound loop when available.
- Reducing glare in classrooms.
- Rooms are well lit for writing.
- Background noise is reduced in demonstrations.
- Where possible videos used have subtitles.

Seating

- Students are seated so they can hear/see clearly teacher or class screen.
- Seating allows for peer/adult support.

Health & Safety

Rooms are maintained to provide a safe working area for students to access.

Resources

- Are accessible where possible in the class rooms.
- Written resources are available in suitable print.

Displays

- Are accessible
- Informative
- Engaging

Adult Support

- LSAs are made aware of the class objective.
- Are encouraged to help students be as independent as possible.

Tasks

- Stimulate interest



- Work appropriately differentiated for individual student.
- Are challenging but manageable.
- Where appropriate draw on real and familiar contexts.
- Build on previous learning in D&T or link to other curriculum areas.

Impact

Impact is demonstrated across our subject area in the following ways:

- The majority of SEND students make progress in Key Stage 3 D&T in line with their targets.
- SEND students that continue into Key Stage 4 meet targets and at times surpass their target.
- SEND at end of Year 11 usually have a positive residual score and a higher P8 score in D&T when compared to their average P8 subject score.
- At Key Stage 4 SEND students that complete a D&T course also develop their skills in organisation, resilience and problem solving.
- SEND students that have studied at Key Stage 5 have gone on to universities or found local employment/apprenticeships.
