Subject: Geography

Intent

- It is our intent that pupils with special educational needs/disabilities (SEN/D) follow the same curriculum, learn alongside their peers and achieve similar outcomes.
- In addition, they may benefit from additional opportunities in the lessons and in the co-curricular activities that are arranged especially for them.

Implementation

As a result of extensive in-house training we are confident that all teachers are effective teachers of pupils with SEN/D and that pupils should be withdrawn from mainstream lessons only when there is a clear rationale for doing so and all relevant stakeholders have been fully consulted.

Consequently, within our subject area, pupils with SEN/D may be:

- Sensitively positioned on the seating plan.
- Working with different resources.
- Working on different activities in lessons.
- And/or receive support from additional adults in the classroom.
- Using access arrangements for students.
- Giving all students opportunities for enrichment.
- Making sure all students achieve lesson outcomes.
- Questioning changed depending on student.
- Geography Club opportunities.
- Trips Iceland, Natural history museum.

Impact

Impact is demonstrated across our subject area in the following ways:

- The subject specific knowledge and skills which students retain in their long-term memories cartographic skills, graphical skills, numerical skills etc. Case study specific knowledge with real relevant and up to date examples used. Research skills, analytical skills and team work skills.
- Pupils are ready for the next stage of their education Small number of students move on to higher education in Geography.
- Skills developed via co-curricular / enrichment activities on offer by the department the experience of Trips.
- All students are given the opportunities to experience field trips from Year 7 Natural history museum, Cheddar Gorge, Kew Gardens, Christchurch & Reading, Year 12 Nettlecombe and Iceland.
