# Desired outcome (Intent)

1. Academic Attainment and Progress for all PP students

PP students will meet or exceed their aspirational target grades.

PP students will perform in line with peers at similar starting points to them.

Year 11 PP students will achieve a + P8 score as a cohort. Particularly linked to the progress of high prior attaining PP students in core subjects.

# Chosen action (Implementation)

All teachers aware of who the PP students are within their classes. Staff training in place to support awareness of challenges PP students face and appropriate classroom strategies to support. Learning dives to support QFT

Data closely monitored and tracked by HOY, PP team, data and Raising Standards team and appropriate interventions put in place such as Accelerated Reader for PP students in KS3, tutoring, PP LSA support in lessons, curriculum adjustment plans

Smaller class sizes for Maths and English particularly for 'low prior attainers'.

# Evaluation

There are some significant positives to identify when looking at the outcomes for Year 11 students last year. They include:

- The significant narrowing of the gap between PP and non-PP students Eng and Maths 5+. PP students performed broadly in line with non-PP students
- PP students out performed non-PP students Eng and Maths 4+
- Positive P8 score achieved for Year 11
  PP cohort as a whole
- PP low prior attainers attaining in line with pupils of a similar starting point
- MA PP students achieved positive P8
  score
- HA PP students achieved a positive P8
  score
- A8 score of PP students was broadly in line with that of non-PP students
- All Year 11 PP students from last year graded in each of their subjects- no student failed to achieve a grade

However, there are still areas of development which need addressing:

The progress of middle and high prior attainers compared to pupils of similar starting point

Breakfast and Hwrk Club offered to 100% of PP students

Tutoring was offered to 100% of all PP students. 70% of Year 11 students had tutoring sessions. Year 10 tuition which historically begins in the Summer term did not happen due to lock down. This will be a priority area of focus for the Autumn Term.

All Year 11 PP students had at least one careers appointment. 11 Year 10 PP students were also identified and had access to a career's appointment.

59 of our PP students also accessed our Student Support Department and which supported in ensuring SEMH PP needs are met and potential barriers removed

Ensuring support of our PP students was a key focus for the school during lockdown. 18 PP students accessed our Summer School provision 65 PP families were supported with FSM vouchers during lockdown period Home Learning Packs were provided to all PP students without access to IT at home



#### 3. Promote excellent attendance for PP students using school systems and procedures

Attendance of PP students, monitored by Attendance Officer and communicated to key staff

First Day response system in place

Importance of attendance highlighted through school assemblies, notice boards, tutor expectations, attendance certificates

Processes in place should attendance fall below 95% including AAP, referral to EWO and other appropriate agencies, rewards in place.

focus on intervention and outcomes

Attendance for PP students across the school last year was 95% just slightly below the school average of 96%.

Our attendance officer has robust systems and processes in place to track the attendance of all students and in particular our most vulnerable.

Early concerns are quickly identified and measures put in place to support.

The Attendance Officer works closely with HOY, SLT, SS department and DA lead to ensure that potential barriers to school attendance are removed.

Parental engagement is crucial and this is a key area we will continue to focus on moving into the next academic year.

## Additional detail

In conclusion, we are very pleased with the Pupil Premium provision at Edgbarrow School last academic year.

A significant amount of intervention and support went towards PP student across all Key stages to ensure they had full access to school life and identified barriers were removed.

Positive to be particularly celebrated are:

- Positive P8 score achieved for Year 11 PP cohort as a whole
- A8 score of PP students was broadly in line with that of non-PP students
- PP low prior attainers attaining in line with pupils of a similar starting point
- Attendance of PP students was broadly in line with that of non -PP students
- No Year 11 students were NEETS
- Support provided for our PP students during lock down

Moving forward a clear area of focus will be identifying and supporting the closure of learning gaps created during lockdown.
