





God created the heavens and the earth. "The heavens" refers to everything beyond the earth, outer space. The earth is made but not formed in any specific way, although water is present. God then speaks light into existence. He then separates the light from the dark and names the light "day" and the dark "night." This creative work occurs from evening until morning - one day.

Creation Day 2 (Genesis 1:6-8)

God creates the sky. The sky forms a barrier between water upon the surface and the moisture in the air. At this point earth would have an atmosphere. This creative work occurs in one day.

Creation Day 3 (Genesis 1:9-13)

God creates dry land. Continents and islands are above the water. The large bodies of water are named "seas" and the ground is named "land." God declares that all this is good.

God creates all plant life both large and small. He creates this life to be self-sustaining; plants have the ability to reproduce. The plants were created in great diversity (many "kinds"). The earth was green and teeming with plant life. God declares that this work is also good. This creative work takes one day.

Creation Day 4 (Genesis 1:14-19)

God creates all the stars and heavenly bodies. The movement of these will help man track time. Two great heavenly bodies are made in relation to the earth. The first is the sun which is the primary source of light and the moon which reflects the light of the sun. The movement of these bodies will distinguish day from night. This work is also declared to be good by God. This creative work takes one day.

Creation Day 5 (Genesis 1:20-23)

God creates all life that lives in the water. Any life of any kind that lives in the water is made at this point. God also makes all the birds. The language allows that this may be the time God made flying insects as well (or, if not, they were made on day six). All of these creatures are made with the ability to perpetuate their species by reproduction. The creatures made on Day 5 are the first creatures blessed by God. God declares this work good, and it occurs in one day.

Creation Day 6 (Genesis 1:24-31)

God creates all the creatures that live on dry land. This includes every type of creature not included on previous days and man. God declares this work good.

When God was creating man, He took counsel with Himself, "God said, 'Let us make man in our image, in our likeness'" (Genesis 1:26). This is not an explicit revelation of the trinity but is part of the foundation for such, as God reveals an "us" within the Godhead. God makes man, and man is made in the image of God (men and women both bear this image) and is special above all other creatures. To emphasize this, God places man in authority over the earth and over all the other creatures. God blesses man and commands him to reproduce, fill the earth and subdue it (bring it under the rightful stewardship of man as authorized by God). God announces that man and all other creatures are to eat plants alone. God will not rescind this dietary restriction until Genesis 9:3-4.

God's creative work is complete at the end of the sixth day. The entire universe in all its beauty and perfection was fully formed in six literal, consecutive, 24-hour days. At the completion of His creation, God announces that it is very good.

Creation Day 7 (Genesis 2:1-3)

God rests. This in no way indicates He was weary from His creative efforts, but denotes that the creation is complete. Further, God is establishing a pattern of one day in seven to rest. The keeping of this day will eventually be a distinguishing trait of the God's chosen people (Exodus 20:8-11).


B Explain Christian views on the resurrection (5 marks)

There are four sources outside the Bible that mention Jesus. These are:

1. Cornelius Tacitus.

Tacitus, a Roman Historian, explained how the Roman Emperor Nero, had blamed the Christians in Rome on a fire that had burnt down most of the city in 64 CE. As Tacitus pointed out, everyone knew that Nero himself had started this fire. Tacitus explained, 'Nero blamed and tortured the Christians. Christ Jesus, from whom this group took their name, was put to death by Pontius Pilate.'

2. Tranquilus Suetonius

Suetonius wrote about the Emperor Claudius, who had ruled the Roman Empire shortly after Jesus was crucified. He tells us: 'Christ, urged on the Jews, who kept causing a disturbance, so Claudius sent them away from Rome.'

3. The Talmud

The Talmus is a collection of Jewish writings, put together from 70CE onwards. It states, 'On the eve of Passover, they hanged Jesus. He practiced black magic and led Israel astray.'

4. Flavius Josephus

Flavius was a very important Jewish Historian and our most important witness to the existence of Jesus. He stated, 'There was a wise man, Jesus. After his crucifixion, he appeared to his followers alive after the resurrection, as the divine prophets had foretold.'



If you have lived a Godly life, and followed Biblical teaching it is believed you will go to heaven where God and are located. Whereas, if you have lived an ungodly live, you may be punished eternally in hell in burning fire.

How can an event that cannot be proven by empirical or scientific evidence be important? Whilst the crucifixion of Jesus is highly likely, there is a lack of evidence to prove he resurrected. If you fail to accept he resurrected, then the fact that he died holds little importance.

A number of events during the crucifixion of Jesus proves that he was the Son of God, therefore for Christians it is a very significant event. For example, at the time of his death the curtain in the temple was torn from top to bottom, showing God's omnipotence and authority.

The Crucifixion story is also extremely important to many Christians as it reflects that God himself understands human suffering that humanity experiences, as he himself suffered as God incarnate. This can help Christians find purpose and meaning in their suffering.

For other religions, the crucifixion of Jesus may not hold the same importance as Christians. For example, Jew's do not believe that Jesus was God incarnate and therefore do not believe he was miraculous. Therefore, they believe that he died on the cross and did not resurrect and they are still waiting on their Messiah.

The crucifixion was part of God's divine plan and was a fulfilment of Old Testament prophecy. For example, Isaiah states, 'He was despised and rejected by mankind'. Therefore, the act reflects that Jesus was the Messiah promised, who was omnipotent enough to forgive humankind.

The crucifixion of Jesus was extremely important as it was an act of atonement for the sins of all humanity. It was necessary to allow the resurrection to take place and is therefore part of the process for the salvation of all humanity and the forgiving of sins. This then enabled humans to live eternally with God in heaven.

Muslims believe that Jesus was one of the 5 prophets, meaning a messenger from God. Therefore, he was not God's son or considered to be the Messiah. For them, the crucifixion holds little importance as Allah saved Jesus from the cross before he died. Therefore, the resurrection didn't occur.

How do we know that the account hasn't been modified and changed over the years? Or, that the story hasn't been exaggerated? After Jesus rose from the dead, there are few references on the Gospels to what Jesus did, therefore how do we know for definite that he really did rise from the dead?

Liturgical: In the Church of England liturgical worship is rooted in the 'service book' written by Thomas Cranmer which lays out how a church service should take place. An example of liturgical worship is the Lord's prayer when the congregation recite this together. Another example is the Eucharist. Liturgical worship is supported by the Bible verse 'where two or more are gathered in my name, I am with them' Matthew 18:20.

Informal: In some churches informal worship is common with little structure or 'liturgy'. These churches emphasise the importance of the holy spirit spontaneously influencing the congregation and is popular in the Pentecostal church. This is similar to the type of worship that would have taken place in the early church.

Individual: Christians believe that a personal relationship with God is important and so private worship is also important. Here a Christian may pray or reflect on their relationship with God alone. The Bible tells believers to both worship with the Church congregation but also to worship God individually.

Life in twenty-first-century Britain

The results of the last government census poll in 2011 showed a changing religious landscape in Britain. Despite falling numbers, Christianity remained the largest religion in England and Wales. Muslims were the next biggest religious group and have grown in the last decade. Meanwhile the proportion of the population who reported they have no religion reached a quarter.


 In the 2011 census, Christianity was the largest religion, with 33.2 million people (59.3 per cent of the population). The second largest religious group were Muslims with 2.7 million people (4.8 per cent of the population).

• 14.1 million people, around a quarter of the population in England and Wales, reported they had no religion in 2011.

 The religion question was the only voluntary question on the 2011 census and 7.2 per cent of people did not answer the question.

Between 2001 and 2011 there was a decrease in the numbers of people who identify as Christian (from 71.7 per cent to 59.3 per cent) and an increase in those reporting no religion (from 14.8 per cent to 25.1 per cent).
 There were increases in the other main religious group categories, with the number of Muslims increasing the most (from 3.0 per cent to 4.8 per cent).

In 2011, London was the most diverse region with the highest proportion of people identifying themselves as
Muslim, Buddhist, Hindu and Jewish. The North East and North West had the highest proportion of Christians
and Wales had the highest proportion of people reporting no religion.






